On-time Graduation Rates (most recent class): 84.7%

Our third class graduated in May 2016. For this class, 84.7% of the students graduated on-time. Of the ones who did not graduate on time, one left the program for nonacademic reasons, one left for academic reasons, while the remaining eleven extended their term of study for various reasons.

NAPLEX Passing Rates for First-time Attempts (past three years): 90.1%

90.1% (171/188) of our graduates with reported first-time NAPLEX scores passed on their first attempt over the past three years.

Student Retention Rates (as of January 1, 2017): 98.8%

Of the 253 students who entered with the current P1, P2, and P3 cohorts, two have left the program due to academic insufficiency and one for nonacademic reasons, leading to an overall retention rate of 98.8%.

Pass Rates for End-of-Year Integrative Experience Courses

Pass rates for the capstone courses PHCY 795 (P1 year) for the past three years and for PHCY 895 (P2 year) for the past two years have been 100% in all cases.

Graduates with Fellowships and Residencies

In 2016, eleven of our graduates went on to a fellowship or residency. This represents 44% of those graduates who sought them.
