



Post-Graduation Employment, Class of 2011

All undergraduate and graduate students with degrees or certificates conferred in May and August 2011 were asked to complete an online survey to gather information about their career development. The survey request went out in November 2011. A follow-up request was sent in December 2011. A total of 364 students were asked to complete the survey. The overall response rate was 29% (104 students).

The margin of error is +/- 12% for undergraduate students, +/- 11% for graduate students, and +/- 8% overall. Survey respondents were asked what sector of the economy they began working in after graduation, whether their major relates to their job, and how much they earn.

When asked if their job was related to their college major, 67% of undergraduate students indicated it was directly or indirectly related (compared to not related). The figure was 80% for graduate students.

The median income category was \$20,000-24,999 for undergraduate students, \$50,000-54,999 for graduate students, and \$45,000-49,999 overall.
