



All undergraduate students with degrees conferred in May 2017 were asked to complete an online survey to gather information about their career development. Additional data were collected via direct outreach to graduates. A total of 164 students were asked to provide data. The overall response rate was 65% (106 students).

Survey respondents were asked what sector of the economy they began working in after completing their baccalaureate degree.
