



## Post-Graduation Graduate School Attendance, Class of 2017

This reports the Class of 2017 undergraduates who received a degree in May 2017 and their subsequent enrollment in graduate education programs. Initial data were collected via the Graduating Student Exit Survey administered April through June 2017. The Career Development Center used the initial survey data to perform ongoing outreach to all students who indicated they were still looking for employment or for whom we had no data on file. Six months post-graduation, of the 164 graduates, USJ has employment/graduate school data on file for 141, representing an 86% knowledge rate.

- Of the 164, a total of 52 (32%) were attending a four-year institution:
  - University of Saint Joseph: 29
  - Other Connecticut four-year institutions: 16
  - Non-Connecticut four-year institutions: 7
- Of the 23 students not attending USJ, 14 attended private institutions and 9 attended public institutions

**Note:** The National Student Clearinghouse does not provide information on students' programs of study. Furthermore, it labels institutions only as two-year or four-year with no distinction in the latter category between institutions that confer bachelor's degrees only versus graduate degrees. Thus, for schools other than USJ, students were presumed to be attending as graduate students. Those attending USJ are confirmed to be graduate students.
