

ART MUSEUM, UNIVERSITY OF SAINT JOSEPH GUIDELINES FOR VISITORS

Please help us preserve the Art Museum's collections for future generations by observing the following guidelines.

Please do not touch the works of art.

Even the gentlest touch can damage art by depositing skin oils and other harmful substances!

Please wear your coat or jacket in the gallery or leave it in a locker or on the coat rack in the lobby coat room.

Accidental damage to works of art can occur if you carry garments over your arm. A coat room, equipped with coin-return lockers is located in the lobby of Bruyette Athenaeum.

Please store oversize items (larger than 8" x 15" x 18") in lockers.

This includes backpacks, large bags, and umbrellas, as well as baby carriers with metal supports. Coin-return lockers are located in the coat room.

Food and drink are not permitted in the Art Gallery.

Please enjoy all refreshments in Bruyette Athenaeum lobby.

Please use pencil (not pen) if you wish to take notes in the galleries.

For your convenience, pencils are readily available at the Gallery Attendant's desk.

Please help ensure the safety of other visitors and the collection by not running or engaging in boisterous behavior.

Photographing and videotaping the *permanent collection* is permitted for personal use only. Tripods, supplementary lighting, and photography for professional or commercial use are not permitted without a pass (see the Gallery Attendant for further information).

Sketching in the Art Museum is permitted. Adults may use graphite, colored pencils, or conté crayons. Children accompanied by adults may use pencils and colored pencils. You may bring a drawing board measuring up to 24"x 36 ".
